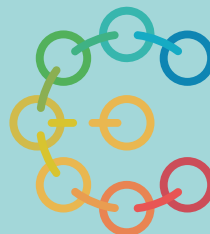

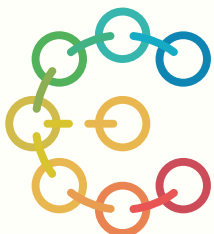

Presenters



Klára Horváth: psychiatrist, psychotherapist, rehabilitation specialist. Psychoanalytically oriented psychotherapist and group analytical psychotherapist. Works in private practice. Her narrower professional interests are large groups and social processes. An active trainer in CSAKIT and the head of CSAKIT School.



Jutta Gliem: M.D., is specialized in psychotherapeutic medicine and general medicine, psychoanalyst, group analyst, group analytic teacher, supervisor and organizational consultant. The small groups meet to discuss the presentations and any other subject they are interested in. There will be small groups in person and small groups online. For the later one, ***please be online at least 15 minutes before*** the discussion group begins, so everyone can be allocated in their rooms.

Large group: we believe that the hybrid format in which both the participants in presence and online are included can provide a space to reflect what is happening around us, among us and within us. There will be three large groups during the conference.

Welcome Reception: a pizza party will be held in the venue, which is a tradition of CSAKIT. We can stay until 21.45 in the building.

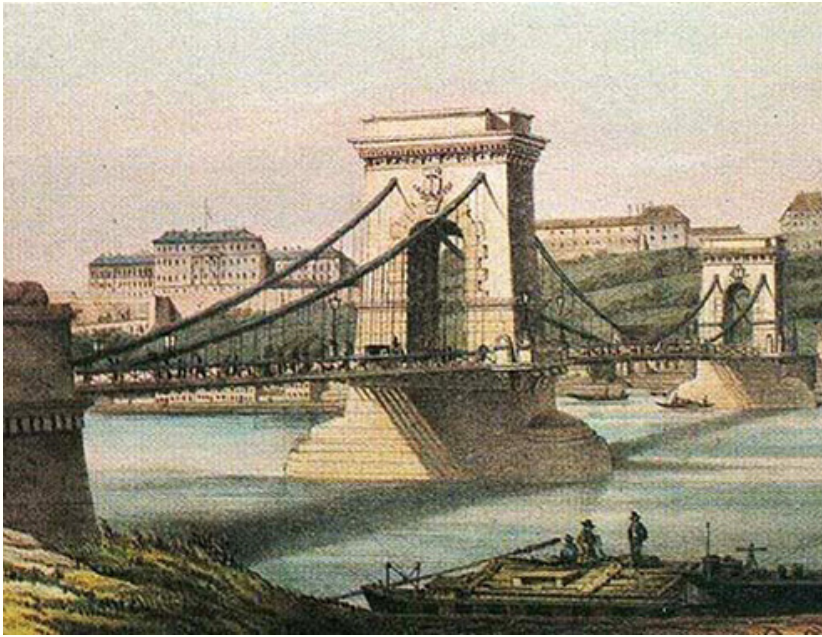
Meeting of EGATIN Committee with Trainees: all trainees (who haven't had their final exam) are welcomed for this meeting in presence or online.

Cultural program, visit to the Parliament: registration needed. The guided tour will allow to discover the heritage and the present of the political history of Hungary, while according to our group-analytical approach we are leaving an imprint on the fabric of its current functioning. About our title

The title and theme of 2023 EGATIN Study Days in Budapest reflect a wide possible range of current social-political and group analytic training processes. Although heritage seems to be something from the past the title is also constructive and forward-looking: we are interested in how heritage affects the present and the future. What we inherit can hold us back, but we can also draw strength from it and create something new.

Originally the 2023 EGATIN Study Days and AGM were to take place in Kyiv. Knowing this, we agreed to organize this event with our political and social environment very much in our mind, in which heritage plays a significant role. This is also true for the organization of EGATIN: what kind of sustaining power does the heritage of the common past have in the challenges of the present?

CSAKIT, the organizing institute is experiencing a growing, evolving, self-reflective phase, where many innovations have been introduced and are constantly being introduced, but we are also aware of being influenced by the institute's past. In the life of associations and trainings transgenerational theme plays an important role. Transgenerational themes are also something we must train our trainees to be able to work with in their groups.

How can a trainee or trained group analyst notice in a group when a buried heritage is resurrecting? How can you train for this?

What processes lead to traumas and intergroup conflicts becoming unprocessed, can they be buried? How do they stay in the matrix of the group and society, how they affect the institutes' training cultures or even the method we train? What do we – trainers, trainees, citizens – do in the present that will become a legacy for the next generations? What factors decides what becomes a heritage in training?

We invite you to take part on searching for these answers and continue to create the future heritage of EGATIN together.
