

After all, we have learned in our training, "Termination process in groups teaches both therapists and patients that 'nothing is forever' in our object relations, our self-strivings and desires, and our lives. This awareness can lead to a new perspective and a new beginning" (Schermer, Klein 1996).

Thus, we wish also to talk about what awaits us after finishing our main professional projects. What can be our new beginning? How to enjoy having time for something we used to dream about? How to leave the professional stage to the others to enter, to trust the younger generation and to enjoy our exit into merely observers position? How to meet wisely, accept and embrace the inescapable 'circle of life'?
